New Helicopter Section

We are planning on establishing a new helicopter section, to help people start out on this side of the hobby – see James Moon for times, assistance with set-up and help with testing of new models.

Child (& vulnerable adults) protection

We need to revisit our policy on this; so there will a major discussion on this at the next monthly meeting on 24th March.

Chairman gets his 'A'

Our esteemed chairman has just passed his 'A' certificate (your editor got his last year). Please try to get this basic safety / competency qualification if you haven't already - it really is guite easy.

Safety

We seem have become too relaxed over the winter building season, lets improve this before something or someone gets broken. Please remember :-

- Use the frequency board.
- No more than 4 aircraft in the air at once.
- Fast & low aircraft, don't mix with slow & low aircraft or with helicopters. Please negotiate flying slots to avoid this; OR ELSE there may be some-one hovering / prophanging in the middle of the patch when your engine stops (or visa-versa).
- Launch and recover from the patch, fly from the flight line, talk in the pits.
- No-fly zones remember these are for safety reasons, which have become even more important with the nursery opening to the public.

Training Co-ordinator

Ted Saddler has been dragooned into the role of training Co-ordinator, he will look after the training equipment (E.G. as club owned buddy leads) and arrange for their use.

Sheep

The Merriott field is currently lunch / bed / toilet for a small flock of sheep.

- Currently the sheep are free roaming, so please close the gate while flying
- By the time you read this there will be a cheap trowel stored with the frequency board, please use this to remove droppings from the path, pits etc before some-one steps it.
- Avoid scaring the mutton (it effects the taste).

Site changes (Merriott)

- With careful juggling, the new waterproof bag just about will hold the grey box, and the frequency pegboard / windsock.

The following projects are known to be in progress :-

- The editor has 57" span an electric Long-EZ-46 awaiting final power plant selection. In accordance with my tradition, this ARTF will take longer to complete than most people take doing a full design and build!
- The chairman is doing a 72.5" "Classic Biplane" despite an obvious shortage of space (see below), this is expected to fly in about a month.
